



THE UIA AND FPAA REINFORCE THEIR COOPERATION

On 2 May 2007 in San Antonio, during the Executive Committee meeting of the Pan-American Federation of Architects' Associations (FPAA), UIA President **Gaetan Siew** and FPAA President **Gabriel Durand-Hollis** co-signed a memorandum of understanding.

This agreement, intended to give **new impetus to the collaborative efforts** between the UIA and the FPAA to promote architects and the architectural profession, is centred around six ambitions:

- . to **rationalise the resources** of the two organisations in order to carry out pertinent and coherent activities at all levels
- . to **reinforce the capacity for intervention** of both organisations
- . to explore opportunities for **joint positions and/or actions**
- . to **collaborate** in relevant **lobbying** activities
- . to ensure **reciprocal representation in each other's working bodies**
- . to share information of mutual interest.

MODERNITY MEETS HERITAGE

On **24 June 2007**, Germany will celebrate its national architecture day on the theme: *Modernity meets Heritage*. The doors of **1 594 contemporary architectural realisations** in **731 cities** will be open to the public during this event that attracted 113 000 visitors in 2006. This year's German architecture day will be officially launched on 23 June at the **Oceanic Museum in Stralsund**, an edifice designed by **Behnisch and Partners** alongside a Baltic Sea port included in the UNESCO World Heritage List. The building itself is a spectacular illustration of the meeting of modernity and heritage.

BEIJING SEMINAR

On 1 through 7 July 2007, in Beijing, People's Republic of China, the 27th international seminar of this UIA work programme will explore the theme: *The architecture of healthcare facilities in the coming 25 years*. It is organised by the **Architectural Society of China** and the Chinese Institute of Project Planning and Research (IPPR).

Healthcare architecture is evolving rapidly based on advances in medical technologies, healthcare organisation, social attitudes, building technology, and procurement processes. The Beijing seminar will examine the following sub-themes in relation to these changes:

- . **Sustainable healthcare facilities** in the future
- . The impact of **traditional medicine** in the future of healthcare facilities
- . Healthcare facilities designed to **face future disasters**
- . Public-private **financing** in a future setting and life-cycle costing
- . **New technologies** in healthcare design.

An exhibition of exemplary projects is also planned within the framework of this seminar.


CALGARY
